"Don't Waste Your Year" by Tim Shull

Money lost can be regained or earned again, but time lost is lost forever. Like money, time can be wasted, spent, or invested. Psalm 90 encourages us to realize how finite our lives, and therefore our years and months and days, are. "Lord, teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." Psalm 90:12. Time can be spent, or it can be invested. Will you spend 2023 or will you invest it?

On this side of heaven, you don't know the impact of your faithfulness or the fruit of your service. You don't know completely the results of your good deeds of kindness and your inspired words of witness. Each health kit you hand to a migrant worker, each senior citizen you bless with your company, each child you teach about God's love, each nail you drive in that ramp you build or that floor you repair, every salvation doll and seafarer's cap that you sew, each prisoner packet or shoebox that you compose, every bed or clothing or food that you give, each struggling friend that you encourage, every prayer you pray...you know it matters but you can't know the full effect of your ministry. Maybe the person that you help will experience a life-change that will divert their life from its downward trajectory of hopelessness and anger. It could be that the life that you bless will go on to be a blessing to others. It may be that the one person you lead to Christ will in turn lead thousands to the Savior.

Edward Kimball was concerned about one of his young Sunday School students who worked at a shoe store in town. One day Kimball visited him at the store, found the student working in the back stocking shelves, and led him to Christ then and there. Dwight L. Moody eventually left the shoe store to become one of the greatest preachers and evangelists of all time.

Moody, whose international speaking took him to the British Isles, preached in a little chapel pastored by a young man with the imposing name of Frederic Brotherton Meyer. In his sermon Moody told an emotionally charged story about a Sunday School teacher who personally went to every student in his class and led each of them to Christ. That message changed Pastor Meyer's ministry, inspiring him to become an evangelist like Moody. Over the years Meyer came to America. While speaking in Northfield, MA a young preacher heard Meyer say, "If you are not willing to give up everything for Christ, are you willing to be made willing?" That remark led J. Wilbur Chapman to respond to the call of God on his life. Chapman went on to become one of the most effective evangelists of his time. A volunteer by the name of Billy Sunday helped set up his crusades and learned how to preach by watching Chapman. Sunday eventually took over Chapman's ministry, becoming one of the most dynamic evangelists of his century. Billy Sunday's preaching brought thousands to Christ.


Inspired by a 1924 Billy Sunday crusade in Charlotte, NC, a group of Christians dedicated themselves to reaching their city for Christ. The group invited the evangelist Mordecai Ham to come and hold a series of evangelistic meetings in

1932. A lanky teenager sat in the huge crowd one evening, spellbound by the message the white-haired preacher gave. Night after night the teen came and finally went forward to give his life to Christ.

That teenager was Billy Graham. Billy Graham communicated the gospel to more people than any other person in history. Yet it all started with a Sunday School teacher named Kimball. Millions have been affected by his decision to go into a shoe store and share Christ with one person. Millions more will continue to receive the blessings.

That kind of exponential outcome still happens today. Trust God and engage and invest. Every deed of kindness, every word of witness...who knows but our God the impact your service will have? Like a small pebble tossed into the ocean of life, it seems insignificant. But that splash sets in motion a ripple effect that continues outward until the waves of that deed lap upon the shores of eternity.
