## **Cross Training: Mind Renewing and Heart Setting** by Tim Shull

In Christ's Great Commandment we are exhorted first to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind," and to love our neighbors as we love ourselves. (Matthew 22:37-40). As we look at the cross, we see a vertical pole and a horizontal beam. For followers of Christ, the vertical pole of loving God supremely is the essential prerequisite and support for the horizontal beam of loving others as ourselves. True worship of God precedes and leads to authentic missionary service and ministry. Be fully aware that we will not learn this Great Commandment behavior from our world, modern American culture, which teaches a self-centered, self-promoting quest for material gain, power-influence, comfort, and entertainment. That's why the apostle Paul admonished, "Don't be conformed to this world, instead be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." (Romans 12:2). Being changed by having our minds renewed means being willing to learn and practice what our Bibles teach us about loving God and loving people.

When this missionary wrote the often quoted, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me," he was not the triumphant victor of a televised sports event. He was in prison explaining his example of Christian contentment no matter the circumstance and no matter the level of prosperity or adversity. (Philippians 4:11-20). "I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content..." Our Lord Jesus, in His "Build Back Better" parable of the rich fool in Luke 12:15-21, declared, "A man's true life is not made up of the things he owns, no matter how rich he may be."

Paul instructed Timothy on how this seminal truth can be learned. "Godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it. But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that. When we long to be rich, we are a prey to temptation; We get trapped into all sorts of foolish and dangerous ambitions which eventually plunge us into ruin." (1 Timothy 6:6-9). "Command those who are rich not to be proud and not to trust in their money which will soon be gone, but to trust in God. Tell them to use their money to do good, to give happily to those in need, always with others whatever God has given them. By doing this they will be storing up real treasure for themselves in heaven -- it is the only safe investment for eternity!" (1 Timothy 6:17-19).

This echoes our Lord's solution: "Don't store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and

steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves don't break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:19-21). Notice that Jesus did not state the expected, 'get your heart right and your money will follow.' No! Jesus said we can train our hearts in the right direction. We can purposefully, intentionally place our treasure in heaven and our hearts will follow. We can lead our wayward hearts in the right direction by deliberately investing our time, talent, treasure, and testimony on things that last forever. When you give, teach, serve, clean, play, sing, help, lead, engage, cook, sew, knit, purchase, package, sacrifice, share, build, work, etc. for the kingdom of God, you are storing up treasure (people) in heaven. The more you invest in things eternal, the more your heart is set in the right place. In this way, we love God and love people.
