Blessed

Gloria and I have been in the ministry together for 35 years, even longer than we've been married. After college at Charleston Southern University, we were blessed to go to New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary shortly after we got married. During college and seminary days I served in church staff positions, principally music and youth. Since graduation from seminary in 1987 I have been a senior preaching pastor. The call of God to *Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; rebuke, correct, and encourage with great patience and teaching* (2 Timothy 4:2), has been a priority for me in the midst of the myriad of all of a pastor's duties.

In the mid 90's God began to impress upon me that we should start a new church, so I began preparing. In 1998 we moved to the midlands. I learned more about starting new churches and Gloria served in the Missions Mobilization Group of the South Carolina Baptist Convention for 13 years. In 2000, we began doing the ground work to plant a new church. The next year we assembled a planting team. Upon the direction of Lexington Baptist Association, we selected an area that needed a new church. Our team first met in a home in the mission area. Then we met in a restaurant and then a community center. We gathered more people, had our first Baptisms in a community pool in August of 2001, and then began meeting every Sunday at Dutch Fork Middle School. Our congregation grew as we reached people who did not go to any church and many who had no church background.

In 2003 River Springs Church was constituted as an autonomous church. We ordained my Associate Pastor Jimmy Parris that year. We broke ground on 15.6 acres between Irmo and Chapin, and we entered our new multi-purpose church building in 2005. We had many baptisms as the Gospel changed lives and produced "springs of living water who each take the Gospel to our dry and thirsty world." I have been stretched in every possible way in the 17 years that I have been planter and pastor of River Springs. Gloria and I have been blessed to see many lives committed to Christ and many strengthened for His service.

When I became Director of Missions for Edgefield Baptist Association, River Springs Church made Rev. Jimmy Parris a Co-Pastor with me, knowing that the day would come that I would step aside and Jimmy would be the senior pastor. That day has come, as I announced at the EBA Fall Meeting.

My resignation from River Springs Church is effective November 17th so that I can devote more time and energy to EBA. This will mean that I will be available to be interim pastor when needed and be in the churches more on Sunday mornings when I am not serving as an interim. While Gloria and I look forward to this new chapter in our life, we are also sad to leave the church we started. So, as you pray for Gloria and me, and our family, also pray for River Springs Church and their Pastor Jimmy Parris and his wife Davii and their sons, Judah and Simon.

Our God who calls us and blesses us will be glorified in this.
