#### Worthy of Worship – by Tim Shull

I know that our churches engage in meaningful and purposeful activities and ministries. In order for good work to endure, a high priority must be given to Worship, both private and corporate. One of the most important things that a church can do, for its members and for its outreach, is to make sure that the Sunday morning worship time is a powerfully relevant meeting of worshipers with the King of the universe. Sunday morning worship, the preaching of the Word and singing of hymns and spiritual songs, should be a high priority. Worship is placing my mind's attention and my heart's affection on the Lord in response to who He is and what He has done. "Worship delights our Father, develops our Family, declares our Faith, and dethrones our Flesh" God is pleased when our worship is accurate, authentic, thoughtful and thankful. In Luke 7:36-50, a sinful woman anointed Jesus's feet at the home of Simon the Pharisee. From her act and Jesus's response we learn that "Worship is activated by bold initiative, demonstrated by costly sacrifice, and motivated by a grateful heart."

Isaiah 6:1-8 shows us that when we worship almighty God, God's presence is experienced, God's pardon is offered, God's purposes are revealed and God's power is displayed. Like Isaiah, when we have an experience with God, we see God for who He is, we see ourselves for who we are, and we see others the way God sees them. When I worship... **1. I see God for who He is.** (Isaiah 6:1-3) He is a High God.

"'For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways,' says the Lord. 'For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts.'" Isaiah 55:8-9. He is a Holy God. "Oh, worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness! Tremble before Him, all the earth." Psalm 96:9. God is God and I am not.

**2. I see Myself for who I am.** (Isaiah 6:4-7) Isaiah realized that he was a sinner. I had a car that I thought was white until I saw it up against the snow. Then I realized that my car was not white. When I see myself in light of who God is, I realize that I am a miserable sinner. Worship provides the opportunity by grace for Confessing and Cleansing. *"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness."* 1 John 1:9. *"Though your sins are like scarlet, they can be as white as snow."* Isaiah 1:18.

**3.** I see Others the way God sees them. (Isaiah 6:8) Once we see God for who He is and see ourselves for who we are, we are able to see others as God sees them. They are, like me, sinners in need of a Savior. In worship God calls us to join Him in His redemptive mission. "*And I* 

heard the voice of the Lord, saying: 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' Then I said, 'Here am I! Send me." Isaiah 6:8. In worship God invites us to commit ourselves to bringing people to know Him, love Him and worship Him. Jesus said, "An hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth. Yes, the Father is seeking such people to worship Him." John 4:23. What does God want? He wants people. He desires passionate and authentic worshipers. He is worthy of our worship and God knows that worshiping Him is the best thing for us. While evangelism produces worshipers, real worship of God provides a proper motivation for evangelism and missions. The more we love God, the more we want to give Him what He wants. We have many good reasons for engaging in soul-winning evangelism and gospel-spreading missions. Put this one on your list: Heaven rejoices and God is pleased when we bring people to faith in Christ and to worship the true and living God.

"Give thanks to the Lord and proclaim his greatness. Let the whole world know what he has done. Sing to Him; yes sing His praises. Tell everyone about His miracles. Exult in His holy name; O worshipers of the Lord, rejoice!"
