NEXT by Tim Shull

The followers of Christ who make up the churches of the Edgefield Baptist Association enjoy a rich heritage of faithfulness, love and devotion. Those who have gone before us set for us examples of selfless service and faithful ministry. Furthermore, we are still surrounded by authentic believers who, in the midst of adversity of advancing years, still find a way to demonstrate the love of Christ. They work hard to perform a myriad of deeds of kindness and they persevere in being witnesses for our Savior.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight and the sin which so easily entangles us and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Hebrews 12:1-2

Our Lord began this race for us and He will complete it. He is the starting leg and the anchor leg. He has called each of us to run our leg of the race marked out for us. We keep our eyes on Jesus and remember all that He endured. His example in Holy Scripture, the empowerment of the Holy Spirit and the encouragement of the people of God give us all we need to run our race with patient endurance. One day soon Jesus will run the anchor leg and bring it all to the finish. (Maranatha!) Until that happens, we run, not just for our generation but also for those who have gone before us and those who run after us. Each generation must pass the baton, the Gospel of Jesus Christ, to the next. Each generation must train up those who will evangelize and disciple and teach and preach and sing and lead.

You must teach these commandments to your children and talk about them when you are at home or out for a walk; at bedtime and the first thing in the morning. Deuteronomy 6:7.

Bring up your children in the training and instruction of the Lord. Ephesians 6:4.

In more than one Olympic Games, Relay teams from the U.S. dropped the baton or otherwise failed to make the exchange. They were the fastest men and the fastest women on the planet, yet they did not win. Likewise for us passing the baton of the Gospel of our Lord to the next person is of supreme importance. Think of people who invested in you, in your

coming to Christ and being discipled and equipped for service. So, in whom are you investing? Who will do your ministry when you can no longer do it? Who is NEXT? Don't just spend your summer. Invest your life in another. Pray, give, work, go, share, reach, teach, love...in your Vacation Bible School, camp, Sunday School and other ways you can make disciples and help equip them for service.

Churches Changing Communities 2018 will emphasize NEXT. We will deliberately show young people and those young in the faith how to communicate the Gospel, how to teach a Backyard Bible Club, how to lead a learning activity or a game or a craft or a song. We won't just do some good in our communities, we'll help to equip the next leaders. Our worship time and group time will help us know who we are and whose we are and how we are created for ministry. (Eph. 2:10) I have the privilege of bringing the messages. The year's CCC will feature a Wednesday fun night at the Williams pond house & pool, student led worship, construction & repair projects, Backyard Bible Clubs at apartments, ministries at various sites, a big Friday block party, and more!
