

Encourage One Another by Tim Shull

Twenty-five years ago, I saw/heard Rick Coram preach a sermon about courage and encouragement. He reached behind a curtain and pulled out an enormous sword. He said it was the size of the sword of Goliath and a friend had made it for him out of lightweight material so he could lift it. In the sermon he talked about how David had kept the armor of Goliath (1 Samuel 17:54, 21:9) and he wondered if, in subsequent times of failure, did David take out that sword to remind him of God's power in the successful times of his life.

It has been said by many that the devil's greatest weapon is discouragement. In thirty-five years of ministry I have found it to be true.

I have been blessed with a ministry/missions-minded wife and we have children who have honored, respected and helped our work. I had a deacon/wife for in-laws and a pastor/wife for parents. And I've been blessed to serve with some of the best church members and leaders a man could hope for. But even with all my blessings I still suffered from perfectionism that wrought futility and criticism that induced discouragement. And I know that many pastors have had it much worse. At schaptist.org/church-life I see that "across the nation 1500 Pastors leave the ministry each month due to moral failure, spiritual burnout, or church contention. 90 % of Pastors work more than 46 hours a week, which can lead to burnout. 80 % of seminary graduates leave ministry within 5 years. 70 % of pastors constantly fight depression. 61 % of pastors admit they have "few close friends". 50 % of pastors' marriages end in divorce." And on top of this, some pastors feel so discouraged/depressed/defeated that they take their own lives. Though the Bible gives the church dozens of directives to encourage one another we still have an epidemic of discouragement in our leaders.

Therefore, I renew my sincere invitation to any pastor to call me any time, 803-760-8042. If I don't answer right away, leave a message and I'll call you back. Or take advantage of a Pastor Care Line from NAMB and *Focus on the Family* to counsel pastors in crisis, 1-844-PASTOR1 or 1-844-727-8671.
