

American Holocaust by Tim Shull

Our Lord Jesus was not Grace without Truth, winking at sin. Neither was He Truth without Grace, offering no mercy. He was Glory, full of Grace and Truth. To the woman caught in adultery He said, "Neither do I condemn you." And He said, "Go and sin no more!" He calls us also to be salt and light in our culture and, in a context of grace, speak the truth in love.

I strongly believe in the sanctity of human life. The Bible is clear that all human life is precious to God. Our Declaration of Independence declares that we are endowed by our Creator "with certain unalienable rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of happiness." The Fifth Amendment to our Constitution states that no person shall "be deprived of life, liberty or property without due process of law." Historically, we failed to follow this ideal by pretending that some people aren't really persons. We said that the American Indian was not a person, so we deprived him of his property. We said that the African slave was not a real person, so we deprived him of his liberty. Today many say that the human baby growing in the womb is not really a person, so we deprive her of LIFE!

The 14th Amendment, a clear override of the infamous 1856 Supreme Court's Dred Scott Decision (that asserted that some human beings are merely property), provides that "[No] State [shall] deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws." But in 1973, the Supreme Court made a decision that is startlingly similar to Dred Scott in its irrational denial to human beings of the rights and protections of legal personhood. **Roe v. Wade is the Dred Scott Decision of our lifetime.** What has followed is unfathomable. Over 60 million pre-born babies have been brutally put to death, many for reasons of convenience or money. And since 2009, taxpayer funding for abortions has been the law, making us all culpable and complicit in the American Holocaust.

Roe v. Wade, distilled to its most basic holding, says that the baby in the mother's womb is not a "person" within the meaning of the 14th Amendment, and is therefore not entitled to equal protection of the law. Justice Harry Blackmun, writing for the majority, acknowledged the tenuous nature of this determination, noting that if "personhood is established, the appellant's case, of course, collapses; for the fetus' right to life would then be guaranteed specifically by the [14th] Amendment."

Given the tremendous advancement of prenatal medical knowledge in the last half century, it is impossible to deny the humanity of the unborn child. From the moment of fertilization, there exists within the woman

a genetically distinct organism, with 46 chromosomes and an unalterable, unique DNA that doesn't change over a lifetime. Within 22 days of conception, this unborn human being has her own circulatory system with her own beating heart pumping her own blood—blood sometimes of a completely different ABO type than the mother's blood. By six weeks, the embryo has eyes, eye lids, a nose, and a mouth complete with lips and tongue. She will often have detectable brain functioning by this time, as well. A week later, the fetus has a complete set of organs. My son was born at 25 weeks gestation, before we made it to the third trimester. I can tell you from watching him fight for his life that the fetus is clearly a human person with a will to live! The person in the womb is: historically protected (pre 1973), affirmed by biology, confirmed by genetics, included in laws concerning harm to pregnant mother & baby, marvelously demonstrated by ultrasound, proclaimed by the Bible, expected by common sense, cherished by parents, and known by God. Yes, let us PRAY that the American Holocaust ends soon. Let us speak the truth in love surrounded by grace. Teach boys and girls that God made them special, male and female. Teach them to learn and live by God's prescription for sex. Be kind, merciful and redemptive to those who have an unplanned pregnancy. Help them. Show them good choices. Then love that baby and show her/him the love of God in Christ Jesus.
