- ONE adult toothbrush (individually factory-sealed, no multi-packs)
- ONE 4 oz to 6 oz toothpaste (no travel size)
- ONE 3.2 oz to 6 oz bar of soap (no travel size, no unwrapped/unboxed bars
- TWO rolls of hard candy like LifeSavers, Mentos, Breath Savers (NO Smarties, Sweetarts, Necco Wafers, Rolos, Starburst, TicTacs)
- FIVE first-class #10 Stamp-Embossed Envelopes (from US Post Office-NO regular stamps, no other size envelope)
- ONE gallon size zipper bag (no other bags accepted)

"Caps Over the Wall" - Tim Shull

50 years ago, Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin walked on the moon. Armstrong declared, "That's one small step for man; One giant leap for mankind." I remember watching it on tv with my family. It was July 20, 1969; but such an amazing feat was a result of a nation committed to reaching a goal, and 400,000 air and space scientists and workers making it a reality. The goal was announced early in the decade when America was losing the space race to the Soviet Union. A new young president called the nation to commit to a goal. John F. Kennedy stood before Congress on May 25, 1961 and proposed that the US "should commit itself to achieving the goal, before this decade is out, of landing a man on the Moon and returning him safely to the Earth." A gallop poll indicated that 58 percent of Americans were opposed. Yet the president leveraged his leadership in pursuit of his vision. On September 12, 1962, President Kennedy delivered a speech before a crowd of about 40,000 people in the Rice University football stadium, many of them students.

"We choose to go to the Moon...We choose to go to the Moon in this decade and do the other things, not because they are easy, but because they are hard; because that goal will serve to organize and measure the best of our energies and skills, because that challenge is one that we are willing to accept, one we are unwilling to postpone, and one we intend to win, and the others, too."

In San Antonio, on the day before his death, at the dedication of the Aeronautics Hospital, JFK told about a story from Irish writer Frank O'Connor. When he and his friends were out exploring and came to an orchard wall that seemed too high to climb, they would toss their hats over the wall, so that they had no choice but to follow. President Kennedy told the O'Connor tale and declared: "This nation has tossed its cap over the wall of space, and we have no choice but to follow it."

I humbly invite you to affirm that you have tossed your cap over the wall. "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." Joshua 24:15. Renew and strengthen your commitment to Christ and to His church. Commitment helps me avoid the bad things in

a world full of temptations. Commitment helps me focus on the best things amid many good things. Commitment helps me persevere when I want to quit. Commitment helps me become the person I really want to be. Commitment helps me to show what my values really are. My commitments shape my life.

Some things on which we spend our time and money are not worth our commitment. Make a short list of the people, groups and causes that you are willing to die for. Then resolve to live for those people and those endeavors. "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service." Romans 12:1. In this season of revival, sing again with me, "I have decided to follow Jesus; no turning back, no turning back."
