Out of the Box

Years ago, Gloria and I were called by our Lord to put together a team that would start a new church in Northwest Columbia, between Irmo and Chapin. We started in a home, then met in a restaurant. We grew into a community center and then met for three and a half years in the cafeteria and adjacent classrooms of Dutch Fork Middle School. We grew a large congregation, with many coming to Christ and being baptized in the pools at the YMCA and in local neighborhoods. God blessed us with 16 acres at an ideal corner location, so we constituted into an autonomous Baptist church and then built a large multi-purpose building. The church building did allow us to bless our community by hosting homeowners' association & crimewatch meetings, job fairs, medical screenings, constituent meetings with our county councilman, and training meetings – everything from CWP training to couponing and quilting. The building was used as the polling place for the local precinct. Blessing the community with the building brought us credibility with our neighbors and opened the door for reaching more people. But I have to say that pure evangelism was accomplished easier before we had a building. And many who had served in ministries and evangelistic events before the building were needed instead to maintain the building & grounds. We tried to avoid it. When we cut the ribbon on the new building, we called it a 'starting line' and not a 'finish line'. But the building drew our attention and money off who we were called to be and what we were called to do.

On a long wall in the Edgefield Baptist Association office are framed photographs of the buildings of the churches that make up EBA. Notice how I said that: the buildings of the churches. Regardless of the old children's rhyme using both hands with interlocked fingers: "This is the church; this is the steeple. Open the doors and there's all the people," we know full well that the church is not a building. The church is people redeemed by the blood of Jesus Christ – sons and daughters of Calvary and of the empty tomb. As these churches organized themselves in this area over the past 257 years, each has seen fit to construct and maintain some sort of building. (Our newest congregation, Iglesia Getsemani, will soon build.)

I love these beautiful buildings, these meeting houses for the worship of almighty God and the preaching of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Many are quite old. Some are built with materials and techniques not used today. And most are not the original building. All the church buildings have been updated or modernized in some way in order to be a better instrument for worship, fellowship, discipleship, ministry and evangelism.

As we devote our lives to following our Lord, we tend to love our church

buildings. This is good up to a point. Some changes and upgrades that would help the church of today reach people are not accomplished for fear of dishonoring the past. The church building must always be an instrument for the present-day church to obey the Great Commandment and the Great Commission of Christ, not a monument to the past and those who lived in the 'good old days.' Is your church building a monument or an instrument? Does your building enable a sentimental journey, strolling down memory lane, preserving the past? Or does your building facilitate and empower your church to be who you are called to be and do all that you are called to do?

Human beings have tried for centuries to put God in a box, to contain Him in our words or creeds or buildings. But God will not be contained. "*The God who made the world and everything in it—He is Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in shrines made by hands. Neither is He served by human hands, as though He needed anything, since He Himself gives everyone life and breath and all things.*" Acts 17:24-25.

I'm happy to say that today that church we started is out of the box, sharing and caring. Their building is still used as an instrument to bless the community and to draw people to the love of God in Christ Jesus.
