Trust His Heart by Tim Shull

Not long ago I saw a sign outside of a church: "Prophecy class canceled due to unforeseen circumstances." That seems emblematic of our last 12 months. Not many well-made plans stood up to the onslaught of changes. What calendar did not undergo constant erasures or white-outs or strike-throughs? Services, ministries, trips, parties, graduations, weddings, family reunions, vacations, revival meetings, homecomings, surgeries, even some funerals have been altered, postponed, or canceled. Public health officials published inconsistent information and directives about the COVID 19 pandemic. And, of course, the disease itself has been devastating for many. The election season was the most polarizing ever. News media contributed hype and spin, giving rise to fear in some of us and uncertainty in all of us. Politics, sports, schools, hospitals, churches, pastors, families and communities have struggled through an unusual year of uncertainty. It has made many believers return to using that conditional phrase, "Lord willing..."

Yet be reminded today and every day that our Sovereign Lord God is still on His throne and that none of this caught Him off guard. He does not sleep, nor slumber, and He is not surprised. His "good and acceptable and perfect will" (Romans 12:2) is woven through the threads of what we see as ever-changing uncertainties. When Christ our Lord said to the storm, "Peace! Be still!", the torrential winds and waves obeyed. When He said to the blind man, "Open your eyes," the man's sight was restored. When He said to the lepers, "Be cleansed," they were transformed from carrying a dreaded disease to health and wholeness. When He called to His friend, "Lazarus, come forth!", life was restored to the man who was four days dead.

In our ever-changing, uncertain world, our Lord is certain and changeless. "The grass withers and flowers fade, but the Word of our God shall stand forever." Isaiah 40:8. Hebrews 13:8 says, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever." His love

for us does not change. His word does not change. His purposes for us do not change. James 1:17 says, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of heavenly lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning." Our hope is built upon the sure foundation of our Lord Jesus Christ, His word, His blood. "Everyone who hears these words of mine and does them is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rains descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was founded on the rock." Matthew 7:24-25.

We may not understand it, and we certainly can't predict what will happen next, but we can be sure and secure that God is in control. "Blessed are those who trust in the Lord and have made Him their hope and confidence." Jeremiah 17:7.

I love the song written by Babbie Mason and Eddie Carswell:


"God is too wise to be mistaken. God is too good to be unkind.
