But we are taking the initiative to do the things that we do in **CCC** – **and more** – **all throughout the year.** We are seeking to carry out the benevolence, repair projects, and ongoing outreach ministries at any time of the year rather than just a week of the summer. Our ministry to **Migrant Workers** has begun. We distributed over 500 health and hygiene kits and a large amount of food to migrant worker camps last week. Rev. Cris Negrete will lead our ministry at several camps each Sunday evening starting June 6, and needs volunteer helpers each Sunday. Margaret Ann Thompson is organizing the food, so let her know when your church can help.
