Edgefield Baptist Association Making History with His Story



Brent and Alisha recently moved back to the United States after living and ministering for four years in Bundibugyo, Uganda, as missionaries with the mission-sending agency Serge.

While they appreciated the opportunity to serve in holistic ministry with the gifts and skills God had given them, they felt a strong passion in their hearts from God during their time

overseas toward discipleship and pastoral ministry specifically in their own language and culture. With a desire to communicate the beauty and transformative power of the gospel at the heart-level, in faith, they decided to return from the mission field and, with much prayer, began to prepare for pastoral ministry.

After moving back to the US in late 2019, they celebrated the birth of their first child, Lilah in December. Since then, God has called them to the Augusta area by providing an opportunity for Alisha to work for Children's Hospital of Georgia as a pediatric outpatient dietitian.

They moved to the Augusta area in September 2020 and began patiently praying and seeking a church to belong to. Brent says in all honesty, he can't fully retrace and connect the dots that led him to Antioch, but he does find himself drawn here.

Brent says the passion, desire and vision he has for pastoral ministry is by loving, serving, teaching, equipping, edifying, and shepherding the congregation entrusted to him as he fosters a people so deeply rooted and founded in the gospel that if overflows into and expresses itself as a deep abiding love; first for God, secondly for one another, and thirdly unto others.

Brent is 34 years old. He and Alisha have been married for six years. Lilah is 15 months old. He is from South Georgia and Alisha is from Virginia.

Brent received an Associate in Psychology Degree and an Associate in Middle Grades Education Degree from Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College and a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Biblical and Theological Studies from Liberty University where he graduated Magna Cum Laude.

I have good news and bad news. First, the bad news. Due to circumstances not unlike last year, we are not able to have our classic CCC (Churches Changing Communities) event this summer. **CCC**, in the traditional way, is canceled for 2021. Much preparatory work at potential work sites must be done in order for a proper week of CCC to take place. That simply wasn't possible this year.

Now the good news. What if we could do the things that we do in **CCC** – **and more** – **throughout the year**? What if we could carry out the benevolence, repair projects, and ongoing outreach ministries at any time of the year rather than just a week of the summer?

Not all things that happened in 2020 were bad. Some of our churches have responded to the pandemic with assertive outreach ministries and compassionate care projects. These churches are asking for other churches to join in doing deeds of kindness together and sharing words of witness together. There are many opportunities. You can hear about what's taking shape, give your input, and see how you and your church can participate. I'd like to have a representative from each church present, and all who are interested are welcome. Yes, we will have our classic CCC in the future. But CCC-365 could be even better.
