You may wonder why our group went all the way to Pennsylvania to help. When Hurricane Ida hit and South Carolina Disaster Relief was asked to respond the Edgefield Unit had a choice to help either Louisiana or Pennsylvania. The timing for putting together a team worked out better to assist in Horsham PA October 4-8. After a day of traveling the team was ready to go to work on their first assignment

Tuesday morning. The chainsaw group spent the morning clearing the yard for the homeowner while the rest of the volunteers worked on removing all items including paneling from the basement that had flooded. Later that day the homeowners (a retired pastor and his wife) were in the yard with the team for prayer and noticed the trailer with Edgefield Baptist Association Disaster Relief imprinted on the side. At first, Pastor Robert Collier, Sr. was at a loss for words, but then shared that he was born in Edgefield and that he knew God had a hand in sending this group to help them. He later sent an email that reads, "Thank you so much for all your help. We were truly blessed by your ministry. May God forever bless you." Our team was willing to go where God led them and to do ministry in His name. "Thanksgiving" by Tim Shull

There has been much adversity. There have been setbacks and losses, even the loss of loved ones. Now is the perfect time to obey the Biblical prescription for the people of God: "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:18.

In September 1620 the separatists known as the Pilgrims sailed to America on the Mayflower. While still on board the small ship they acknowledged God's sovereignty in their lives and their need to obey Him; they documented and declared that they were establishing the colony "for the glory of God and for the advancement of the Christian faith."

We know the story about how after the harvest of 1621, Governor Bradford proclaimed a day of thanksgiving and prayer. Please see the dramatic context. The thanksgiving and praise that they offered up to God was the product of their trust in God pounded upon the anvil of adversity. That little band of separatists had set out for northern Virginia, only to get blown off course and come to shore hundreds of miles to the north at Cape Cod. They had hardly established themselves when the cold Massachusetts winter was upon them. They faced that bleak winter without adequate provisions, and it wasn't long before there were more crosses in the cemetery marking new graves than there were pilgrims alive remaining. Only 50 of the original 102 had survived! They strongly considered giving up and going back to England, but they decided to stay on and plant a few acres of corn and barley. When the time of the first anniversary of their landing rolled around, discussion arose as to how it should be observed. Some proposed a Day of Mourning when attention would be focused on all those who had died. But others said, "No, let us have a season of thanksgiving! After all, 50 of us have survived. We have gathered a good harvest; the Indians have been our friends. Let us focus on our blessings, not our adversity nor what we have lost."

Thanksgiving in adversity is a Biblical mandate for God's people. "Let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name. And do not forget to do good and to share, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased." Hebrews 13:15-16. Psychologists tell us that sincere gratitude, thanksgiving, is the healthiest of all human emotions. I submit to you that ingratitude is the starter sin, the on-ramp onto the highway of depravity and perversity. Read Romans 1:18-25 and see if you agree. "For though they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God or show gratitude. Instead, their thinking became

worthless, and their senseless hearts were darkened." Romans 1:21. Lack of thankfulness to God is a serious sin that leads to ignorance, idolatry, foolishness, and depravity.

Notice the advertisements and stores with Halloween displays, decorations and merchandise. Right after Halloween they go straight to promoting Christmas. There are few Thanksgiving displays and merchandise. Thanksgiving is not very marketable, it seems.

Promote real thanksgiving in your home and family. Be careful to praise God from whom all blessings flow and not be like the hogs that eat the acorns off the ground and never look up to see where they came from. Here is a painful but profitable exercise: Think of the people, possessions, resources and blessings in your life. Imagine that something threatened to take them away from you. How hard would you pray for God to allow you to keep those blessings? Pray that hard now. Thank God for your blessings with that kind or fervor, intensity and passion.

"It is good to give thanks to the Lord, and to sing praises to Your name, O Most High; to declare Your lovingkindness in the morning, and Your faithfulness every night." Psalm 92:1-2.
