Janie Chapman Offering for State Missions and Week of Prayer



The 2019 Janie Chapman Offering for State Missions, Missions Education, and Kingdom Advance in South Carolina helps missions and ministries throughout our state. Many students are empowered for missions in key areas.

More than 800 internationals, representing 35 countries, enter SC Baptist Convention churches each week to learn English as a Second Language. Twenty-five professions of faith and nine baptisms were recorded among these workers and students. Prisoner packets, Camp La Vida, mission trips, hunger ministries, new church plants and dozens of church re-starts have been equipped and empowered by the Janie Chapman Offering.

Small associations like Edgefield Baptist Association benefit from grants made possible by the Janie Chapman Offering. With these grants we have funded building and repair projects, mission trips to Boston, Spanish Language Bibles, and CCC projects. We encourage giving through the state missions offering and we appreciate the help that we receive from it.

This ministry was begun by a group from Saluda, SC and the Edgefield FCA has gone to minister there for the past five years. Stewardship of our Lives - Tim Shull

The Bible says, "The tithe is the Lord's." "The tithe is holy unto the Lord." "Bring you all the tithes into the storehouse." Tithing is giving to God through my church the <u>first</u> tenth of my increase, what I earn. "On the first day of each week, you should each put aside a portion of the money you have earned." 1 Corinthians 16:2.

The tithe is the laboratory in which God teaches me to how to trust Him. When we learn to give Him the first tenth of our income, whether we think we can afford it or not, we learn to trust in God, no matter the circumstance. John Bisagno said, "In my judgment, the greatest thing I can do for a person is tell him/her how to be saved; the second greatest thing I can do for that individual to tell him how to walk with the Lord on a daily basis, and the third thing would be how to be rightly related to God in giving." You see, tithing is a part of Biblical Christian stewardship, which is a large part of Christian discipleship.

The Bible has much to say about how we are to manage all that God has placed into our hands. Jesus our Lord spoke more about our relationship to our physical possessions than he did any other subject. "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:19-21. Randy Alcorn in his book THE TREASURE PRINCIPLE says, "The tithe is God's historical method to get us on the path to giving. It's unhealthy to view tithing as a place to stop. Tithing is not the ceiling of giving; it's the floor. It's not the finish line of giving; it's just the starting blocks. Tithing can be the training wheels to launch us into the mindset, skills, and habits of grace giving." Tithing is important, but we sing, "I Surrender All" not "I Surrender One-Tenth". Lonnie Shull, Jr. wrote, "I was asked to come by the home of a certain family who were prospects for our church. They wanted to talk with me about joining our church. I had not been there long when the husband/father asked, 'Preacher, how much will it cost me to be a member of your church?' It caught me little off guard and I replied, 'All you are, everything you have, and everything that you will have."

I tithe, not because God commands me to, though He does. I tithe, not because my church and its ministry and missions need my support,

though it does. I tithe, not because my money supports missions around SC, North America, and the World, though it does. I tithe, not because God promises to bless me when I do, though He does. I tithe, not because I am afraid that if I don't, God might adjust my income to match my tithe, though He might. I tithe, not because the Holy Spirit will use my trust and obedience to grow my faith, though He will. I tithe because I am so grateful for all that God has done for me. I could never out-give Him or pay Him back, but I can love Him back and show my thanksgiving for His mercy and grace.
